Mission to Seafarers: Please drop in for a visit at our Open House on Sunday, Sept 27 from 1:30 - 4 p.m. This is a good opportunity for anyone interested in volunteering to check the Centre out. As we prepare for the fall harvest coming into the port, we invite donations of warm men’s clothing (all sizes). Many of the sailors come from warm climates and find our fall weather cold. Donations can be dropped off in the box outside the Centre or given to the parish Rep at each church. It is not too early to consider donations for Christmas gift bags to be given to the seafarers in Dec. Suggested donations include mittens, gloves, writing paper, and wrapped candy and need to be received at the Centre by Nov. 17

“Jesus at the Turning of the Ages” is a free, online course offered by Wycliffe College this fall.
