### Lift up Your Hearts

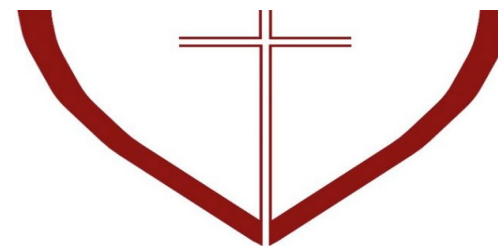
Lift up your hearts! We lift them, Lord, to Thee

Today we arrive at the **Lift Up Your Hearts** fifth and final Sunday of the *Lift Up Your Hearts* initiative. With the other congregations of the **celebrating God's generosity** Diocese of Algoma, we have heard about God's gifts to us and our proper response - to offer ourselves as living sacrifices to God and to the world which God loves. Today, on All Saints Day, as we continue to celebrate God's generosity, we hear about the glorious future God has in store for us and for all his saints - all the faithful people of God, past, present, and future, who put their trust in God's gift of salvation in Jesus Christ.

"Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death.. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well knowing that God honours our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come" (from *Sundays and Seasons*, Augsburg Fortress).

We continue our series of Bible studies. Since they are not sequential in nature, feel free to attend those you can. Two opportunities for the study are offered each week on Tuesdays, one starting at 2:30 p.m. at 198 Saxon Drive, and the second at the church hall starting with a simple supper at 6 p.m.
